- **Important: the Intern Who is Chart Checking Should Stand Next to the Documenting Nurse at All Times to Input and Confirm the Orders**
- The Chart Checking Intern Should Chart Check via Haiku
- **Important: Closed Loop Communication Is Imperative to Ensure that the Proper Order Is both Placed in the Computer, and Again when the Medication Is Being Administered!**

Code Blues

- **Code Blues** Are a Different Screen, and the Nurse Just Clicks the Appropriate Orders on This Screen for Documentation Purposes. **The Orders Generally Do Not Need to Be Searched.**
- **The buddy resident, however, should still stand next to the nurse to help and to chart check on Haiku**

Important!

- Nursing actually has a very hard job documenting rapids with this new system
- It is very complex and onerous
- The buddy resident should please help the nurse learn the navigator, once the resident has completed their own chart checking on Haiku
- **The buddy resident cannot be dismissed, unless the MAR decides to take up the buddy resident responsibility!!!**
