GADOLINIUM INTRAVENOUS CONTRAST FOR MRI Information Sheet

Your imaging procedure today involves the administration of an intravenous contrast agent that contains **gadolinium**. The purpose of this dye is to provide the radiologist with a more detailed picture and will **help in interpreting** your examination.

Intravenous gadolinium is administered by injection through a small needle placed into your vein.

This material has been in use for many years and is **generally considered safe.** As with any medication or pharmaceutical, a very small number of patients may experience side effects related to its administration, such as: nausea, headache, or coldness at the injection site. Life-threatening allergic reactions are extremely rare and occur with a much lower frequency than is observed after administration of other intravenous contrast materials.
